AN ACT to provide greater protection for victims of domestic violence and to make provision for the granting of protection orders and for matters incidental thereto and connected therewith.

[By Proclamation]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the House of Assembly of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines and by the authority of the same, as follows:

PART I

PRELIMINARY

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Domestic Violence Act, 2015.
- (2) This Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by the Governor-General by Proclamation published in the Gazette.
 - 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires-
 - "abuser" means the person against whom a report under section 3 is made:
 - "applicant" means a person who applies or on whose behalf an application is made for an order pursuant to section 5;
 - "approved social worker" means a person experienced and qualified in social work and approved by the Minister in writing;
 - "attorney-at-law" means an individual who is duly admitted and entitled to practice law in Saint Vincent and the Grenadines;

- "child" means a person under the age of eighteen years
 - (a) normally resides with the applicant whether or child is a child of the applicant and the respon either of them; or
 - (b) is an adopted child, a stepchild, or a child who is as a child of the family; or
 - (c) is related by consanguinity or affinity to eit applicant or the respondent; or
 - (d) is in the care and protection of the applicant respondent; or
 - (e) is a person of whom either the applicant respondent is a guardian; or
 - (f) is or has been a member of a shared household
 - (g) is not a person who is or has been married;
- "Court" means the Family Court;
- "cohabitant" means a person who is living or has lived person of the opposite sex as a husband or wife al not legally married to that person;
- "dependant" means a person over the age of eighteen who by reason of physical or mental disability, infirmity is reliant on either the applicant or the resp for his or her welfare;
- "Director" means the Director of Family Services appointe section 6 of the Children (Care and Adoption) Act;
- "domestic relationship" means a relationship betw applicant and a respondent in any of the following
 - (a) they are or were married to each other, inc marriage according to any law, custom or religi
 - (b) they are cohabitants or were cohabitants;
 - (c) they are the parents of a child or are persons who r had parental responsibility for the child, who not at the same time;

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- (d) they are family members related by consanguinity, affinity or adoption;
- (e) they would be family members related by affinity if the persons referred to in paragraph (b) were, or were able to be married to each other;
- (f) they are or were in an engagement, dating or visiting relationship which includes but is not limited to an actual or perceived romantic, intimate or sexual relationship of any duration; or
- (g) they share or shared the same household or residence;
- "domestic violence" means any controlling or abusive behaviour that harms the health, safety or well-being of a person or any child and includes but is not limited to the following-
 - (a) physical abuse or threats of physical abuse;
 - (b) sexual abuse or threats of sexual abuse;
 - (c) emotional, verbal or psychological abuse;
 - (d) economic abuse;
 - (e) intimidation;
 - (f) harassment;
 - (g) stalking;
 - (h) damage to or destruction of property; or
 - (i) entry into the applicant's residence without consent, where the parties do not share the same residence;
- "economic abuse" means the avoidance of financial obligations owed to the applicant and child or a dependant of the respondent, including mortgage or rental obligations;
- "emergency monetary relief" means compensation for monetary losses suffered by an applicant and any child at the time of the issue of an interim protection order as a result of the domestic violence, including-
 - (a) loss of earnings;
 - (b) medical and dental expenses;

- (c) moving, relocation and accommodation ex
- (d) household necessities and other interim ex
- "emotional, verbal and psychological abuse" means or humiliating conduct by the respondent to the including-
 - (a) repeated insults, ridicule or name calling;
 - (b) repeated threats to cause emotional pain;
 - (c) the repeated exhibition of behaviour which serious invasion of the applicant's priva integrity or security;
- "firearm" shall have the meaning assigned to it under the Act:
- "harassment" means engaging in a pattern of cc induces the fear of harm, including-
 - (a) watching or loitering outside of or near the place where the applicant resides, works or business, studies or happens to be;
 - (b) repeatedly making telephone calls or inducing person to make telephone calls to the application or not conversation ensues:
 - (c) repeatedly sending, delivering or causing the of letters, telegrams, packages, facsimiles, mail or other objects to the applicant;
- "interim protection order" means an order made protection 6:
- "intimidation" means uttering, conveying or causing to receive a threat which induces fear;
- "judicial officer" means a judge or a magistrate;
- "member of the household" means a person who norm in the same dwelling house as the applic respondent and is related to the applicant or resj blood marriage or adoption;

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- "Minister" means the Minister charged with responsibility for social services;
- "order" includes an interim protection order and a final protection order;
- "police officer" means any member of the police force as defined in the Police Act;

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- "physical abuse" means any act of assault;
- "probation officer" means an officer appointed as such by the Probation of Offenders Act,

Cap.

- "protection order" means an interim order issued under section 6 and a final protection order issued under section 13;
- "Registrar" means any person assigned to the Court to perform the functions of registrar of the Court;
- "respondent" means a person who is or has been in a domestic relationship with the applicant and against whom the applicant has applied for an order under this Act;
- "sexual abuse" means any sexual conduct that abuses, humiliates, degrades or otherwise violates the sexual integrity of the applicant;
- "shared household" means a household where the applicant and the respondent live or lived together in a domestic relationship;
- "spouse" includes a former spouse, a cohabitant or a former cohabitant;
- "stalking" includes repeatedly following, pursuing or accosting the applicant;
- "victim" means any person who alleges to have been subjected to an act of domestic violence;
- "visiting relationship" means a non co-habitational relationship which is otherwise similar to the relationship between husband and wife.
- 3. (1) A police officer, at the scene of an incident of domestic violence, or when the incident of domestic violence is reported shall-

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- (a) if it is reasonably practicable to do so, inform of his or her rights; and
- (b) hand the victim a printed copy of the informat to the right of the victim pursuant to parag the form set out in Schedule 1.

Schedule 1

- (2) Upon the report of a breach of a protection order officer by a person or a victim, the police officer shall inform the victim of the right to lodge a concurrent complaint a respondent if a criminal offence appears to have been commit the person, the victim or a child.
- (3) The Director may inform any person or a victima available pursuant to this Act.

Arrest by police officer without warrant

4. Subject to section 21, a police officer may arrest an the scene of an incident of domestic violence, without a wan the police officer reasonably suspects of having committee domestic violence.

PARTII

PROTECTION ORDERS

Person entitled to apply for a protection order

- 5. (1) A person referred to in subsection (2) may a Court, in the form set out as Form I in Schedule 2, for a protecti the grounds that the respondent engaged in domestic violen
- (2) An application for a protection order refe subsection (1), may be made by-
 - (a) the spouse of the respondent;
 - (b) a member of a shared household, either or own behalf or on behalf of any other mer shared household;
 - (c) a child;
 - (d) a dependant;
 - (e) a parent or sibling by consanguinity or affin the spouse or respondent not being a mer shared household;
 - (f) a person who has a child in common respondent;

Schedule 2

- (g) a person who is or has been in a visiting relationship with a person of the opposite sex for a period exceeding twelve months; or
- (h) a person who is or has been in a visiting relationship with a person of the opposite sex for a period less than twelve months, provided that the consent of an approved social worker is first obtained.
- (3) An application made pursuant to subsection (1) may be brought on behalf of the applicant by any other person, who has a material interest in the well-being of the applicant, including a police officer, the Director, a probation officer or an approved social worker, except that the application shall be brought with the consent of the applicant, but such consent shall be dispensed with in circumstances where the applicant is-
 - (a) a child;
 - (b) a dependant;
 - (c) physically or mentally incapacitated by unsoundness of mind or a disability;
 - (d) unconscious;
 - (e) under the influence of intoxicating liquor or is misusing drugs; or
 - (f) a person whom the Court is satisfied is unable to provide the required consent.
- (4) Pursuant to subsection (3), a child or dependant may appropriate a protection order through-
 - (a) a person with whom the child or dependant ordinarily or periodically resides or resided or is reliant upon for his or her welfare or any adult member of his or her household;
 - (b) a parent or guardian or a person who is in loco parentis to the child;
 - (c) the Director or other person who has parental responsibility for the child; or
 - (d) a parent or person who has responsibility for the dependant.

- (5) The application made pursuant to subsection (brought outside the ordinary hours of the Court or on a day wan ordinary day for the sitting of the Court.
- (6) The application for an order under this sectic supported by evidence on affidavit unless the Court otherv and an affidavit must include-
 - (a) the facts on which the application is based
 - (b) the nature of the order applied for; and
 - (c) the name of the police station at which the a likely to report any breach of the order.
- (7) The application made pursuant to this section accompanied by supporting affidavit of any person who has of the matter concerned.
- (8) The applicant may request that his or her physibe omitted from the protection order.
- (9) The application and affidavits shall be lodge Registrar who shall forthwith submit the application and the af consideration of the Court.
- (10) In considering an application made pursuant to (1), the Court-
 - (a) may require further evidence-
 - (i) which may be adduced orally;
 - (ii) which may be adduced by affidavit;
 - (iii) as the Court may order pursuant to sub and
 - (b) shall record any further oral evidence paccordance with paragraph (a) (ii).
- (11) Upon request, the Court may provide the assi legal officer to an applicant, in completing any affidavit req this section.

Power of Court to issue interim protection order

Schedule 2

6. (1) If the Court is satisfied that the respondent is c or has committed or is likely to engage in conduct that would an act of domestic violence, the Court shall issue an interim order against the respondent, in the form set out as Form 2 in

- (2) The Court may issue an interim protection order, pending the hearing and determination of the proceedings for a protection order, if it appears necessary or appropriate to do so in order to ensure the safety and protection of the applicant.
- (3) In exercising its powers pursuant to this section, the Court shall not refuse to issue an interim protection order by reason of the fact that the respondent has not been given notice of the proceedings.
- (4) An interim protection order issued pursuant to this section must be served on the respondent and must call upon the respondent to show cause on the return date specified in the interim protection order as to why the interim protection order should not be confirmed.
- (5) The return date referred to in subsection (4) must not be less than ten days after the date of the order.
- (6) An interim protection order may be made for such period of time as the Court considers necessary but shall not exceed twenty-eight days.
- (7) An interim protection order shall have no effect until it has been served on the respondent in the manner provided for in section 10 (1).
- 7. (1) A protection order issued by the Court pursuant to this Act may prohibit the respondent from-

- (a) committing any act of domestic violence;
- (b) enlisting the help of any person to commit any act of domestic violence;
- (c) entering the shared household, except that the Court shall impose this prohibition only if it appears to be in the interests of the applicant or any child or dependant;
- (d) entering a specified part of the shared household;
- (e) entering the residence of the applicant;
- (f) entering the place of employment of the applicant;
- (g) preventing the applicant, any child or dependant who ordinarily resides or has resided in the shared household from entering or remaining in the shared household or a specified part of the shared household;

- (h) taking possession of, damaging, convolute otherwise dealing with property that the apphave an interest in, or is reasonably us applicant as the case may be;
- (i) approaching the applicant within a specifie or
- (i) committing any other act as specified in the
- (2) In addition to the prohibitions referred to in subthe Court may direct-
 - (a) that any or all of the conditions of an order for the benefit of a child or dependant;
 - (b) the respondent to-
 - (i) return to the applicant specified proper his or her possession or under his or h
 - (ii) pay emergency monetary relief to the:
 - (iii) pay interim monetary relief to the appli benefit of a child or dependant, where existing order relating to maintenance time as an obligation for support is c pursuant to any other law;

- (3) The Court may impose any additional conditions which it considers reasonably necessary to provide and protect the safety of the applicant, any child or dependant, including but not limited to an order that a police officer shall accompany the applicant to a specified place to supervise the collection of personal property.
- (4) The Court may direct that any or all of the prohibitions or conditions contained in an order apply for the benefit of a child or dependant.
 - (5) The Court may-
 - (a) refuse the respondent contact with any child if it is shown that such contact is not in the best interests of the child; or
 - (b) order structured contact with any such child.
- (6) The Court shall not refuse to issue an order under this Act on the basis that-
 - (a) a single act has been committed or a single threat has been made by the respondent; or
 - (b) the acts or threats when viewed in isolation, appear to be minor or trivial.
- (7) Where pursuant to subsection (2) (c) the Court makes an order which includes counselling or therapy, the order must specify-
 - (a) that the Court receive written notification from the counsellor or therapist of sessions missed by the applicant, the respondent or both, as the case may be, without reasonable excuse; and
 - (b) the date by which the counsellor or therapist shall submit a report to the Court in respect of the counselling or therapy.
- (8) Where the Court makes an order which includes a direction that the respondent-
 - (a) vacate any shared household; or
 - (b) return to the applicant specified property that is in his or her possession or control,

the Court may, in the same order, if it considers necessary, di officer to remove the respondent either immediately or within time from the shared household, or to accompany the appl case may be, either immediately or within a specified time premises, in order to supervise the removal of property belo applicant and to ensure the protection of the applicant.

- (9) A protection order may be for such period ε considers necessary but shall not exceed three years.
- (10) Where an order contains any prohibitions or di-Court shall specify different periods, none of which shall e years, as the period for which each prohibition or direction shforce.

Matters to be considered by Court

- 8. In determining whether or not to impose one or prohibitions or issue a direction specified in section 7, the have regard to the following-
 - (a) the nature, history, or pattern of the domestic has occurred and whether a previous interin order or a final protection order has been issue
 - (b) the need to protect the applicant and any othe whose benefit the order has been granted f domestic violence;
 - (c) the welfare of any child;
 - (d) the accommodation needs of the applicant ar person;
 - (e) the hardship that may be caused to the application of making the order;
 - (f) the income, assets and financial obligations respondent, the applicant and any other person the order;
 - (g) the need to preserve and protect the institution and other relationships whilst affording proassistance to the family as a unit; and
 - (h) any other matter that, in the circumstances of t Court considers relevant.

9. (1) The Court may make an order directing a police officer to seize any firearm or dangerous weapon in the possession of the respondent, if the affidavit made pursuant to section 5 (6) contains information to the effect that-

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- (a) the respondent has threatened or expressed the intention to kill or injure any person in a domestic relationship, including himself or herself whether or not by means of the firearm or dangerous weapon; or
- (b) possession of the firearm or dangerous weapon is not in the best interests of the respondent or any other person as a result of the respondent's-
 - (i) state of mind or mental condition;
 - (ii) inclination to violence, whether a firearm or a dangerous weapon was used in the violence or not; or
 - (iii) the use of or dependence on intoxicating liquor or drugs.
- (2) The Court shall direct the Registrar to refer a copy of the affidavit made pursuant to section 5 (6) to the Commissioner of Police for consideration in accordance with the provisions of the Firearms Act, if the Court had ordered the seizure of any firearm pursuant to this Act.

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10. (1) Upon an application for a protection order pursuant to section 5 (1) and the granting of an interim protection order by the Court, a copy of the application and the interim protection order, together with the notice of the date on which, and the time at which the respondent is to appear before the Court to show cause as to why the interim protection order shall not be confirmed, shall be served on the respondent.

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(2) A notice of the proceedings pursuant to subsection (1) shall be issued in the form set out as Form 3 in Schedule 2.

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- (3) Where an application is filed in respect of a child or dependant, a copy of the application, together with notice of the date on which, and the time and place at which, the application is to be heard, shall as soon as practicable be served on the parent or guardian of the child or dependant or other person with whom the child or dependant ordinarily resides or resides on a regular basis.
- (4) A notice of proceedings which is issued and served under this section shall be deemed to be a summons that is duly issued and served pursuant to the Rules of the Court made under section 33 and

shall compel the respondent to appear in Court to ans application.

- (5) A notice of proceedings issued under this Act mon the respondent or his or her agent and the Court shall recesservice by affidavit in the form set out as Form 4 in Schedule
- (6) Where the hearing of an application is adjourn the application and notice of the proceedings have not bee the respondent, the time and place fixed by the Court for th hearing, shall be the date, time and place stated in the ne proceedings.

Service other than personal service

- 11. (1) Where the Court has not served notice of pursuant to section 10 or the interim protection order on the personally, it may make an order for substituted service of t the proceedings or interim protection order, as the case may
- (2) For the purpose of subsection (1) "substitut means service-
 - (a) by registered post to the last known addrespondent;
 - (b) by leaving the document at the last know the respondent or his or her closest relative
 - (c) at the workplace of the respondent;
 - (d) by advertisement in a newspaper of general which service is deemed to have been midnight on the date of the later adverticost to be borne by the applicant; or
 - (e) provided in such other manner as the Cour

Filing of affidavits

- 12. (1) The respondent shall, before the return date, Registrar supporting affidavits showing cause as to why protection order must not be confirmed.
- (2) A copy of the affidavits of the respondent shabe served on the applicant.
- (3) The applicant, upon receipt of the affidavits ma return date, file a replying affidavit together with any supporti with the Registrar in which shall be stated the reasons why protection order must be confirmed.

- (4) A copy of the replying affidavit of the applicant shall forthwith be served on the respondent.
- (5) On the return date, the Registrar shall submit to the Court the-
 - (a) application for the protection order;
 - (b) the interim protection order granted;
 - (c) any supporting affidavits made by the respondent; and
 - (d) any replying affidavits made by the applicant.
- 13. (1) Where notice of the proceedings has been served on the respondent in accordance with sections 10 or 11 and the respondent fails to appear in person at the time fixed for the hearing, the Court may-

Power final order

(a) proceed to hear and determine the matter in the absence of the respondent and issue a final protection order in the form set out as Form 5 in Schedule 2; or

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- (b) if the Court is satisfied, having regard to the materials before it, that it is appropriate to do so adjourn the matter and issue a warrant for the respondent to be apprehended and brought before the Court.
- (2) If the applicant or the person on whose behalf the application is made fails to appear either in person or represented by an attorney-at-law, on the return date as stated pursuant to section 6 (4) and (5) and the respondent appears in Court, the Court may-
 - (a) dismiss the application;
 - (b) having received a reasonable excuse for the nonappearance of the applicant or other person, adjourn the hearing on such terms as it considers just; or
 - (c) where it is satisfied, having regard to the submissions before it, that it is appropriate for evidence to be given by affidavit pursuant to this section, it may so direct, but the Court shall, on the application of any other party, order the attendance for cross examination of the person making such affidavit.
- (3) If the respondent appears on the return date in order to show cause as to why the interim protection order should not be issued

or confirmed and the applicant or the person on whose application is made also appear the Court must proceed-

- (a) to hear the matter and consider any evidence received under section 5 (6) and (7); and
- (b) to consider such further affidavits or oral it may direct, which shall form part of the r proceedings.
- (4) At the hearing of the matter, the Court may-
 - (a) decide the matter on the papers in the abser or both of the parties; or

- (b) refer the matter for oral evidence.
- (5) At the conclusion of the hearing pursuant to su (a) or (b), the Court-
 - (a) may confirm, amend, or set aside the interir order; and
 - (b) shall issue a final protection order in the for Form 5 in Schedule 2.
- (6) The Registrar shall forthwith notify the parties and shall-
 - (a) serve the original final protection order resubsection (5) (b) on the respondent;
 - (b) serve a certified copy of the final prote referred to in subsection (5) (b) on the app
- (7) A final protection order shall be for such period considers necessary but shall not exceed three years.
- (8) Where a final protection order contains any prodirections, the Court may specify different periods, none of exceed three years, as the period for which each prohibition shall remain in force.

Explanation of orders

- 14. Where the Court proposes to make an interim proto or a final protection order and the respondent is before the Court shall explain to the respondent:
 - (a) the purpose, terms and effect of the order;

- (b) the consequences of failing to comply with the order; and
- (c) the means by which the order may be varied or revoked.
- 15. A respondent shall not be bound by a final protection order issued pursuant to section 13-

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- (a) if he or she was not present at the time of the making of the order; or
- (b) if the order has not been served on him or her personally or in accordance with section 11.
- 16. (1) Where an order is in force, a party to the proceedings in respect of whom the order was made may make an application to the Court in the form set out as Form 6 in Schedule 2, for an order to vary or revoke the order that is in force.

Variati revoca orders

(2) On an application made pursuant to subsection (1), the Court may by order, vary or revoke the order.

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- (3) A copy of an application made under this section must be served on each person who was a party to the proceedings in respect of which the original order was made.
- (4) In determining whether to vary or revoke an order and issue an order in the form set out as Form 7 in Schedule 2, the Court shall have regard to the matters specified in section 8.
- 17. Where an interim protection order or a final protection order is made or varied by the Court-

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- (a) the Registrar shall arrange for the order to be drawn up in the form set out as Form 6 in Schedule 2 and filed with the Court; and
- (b) the Court shall serve a copy of the order on:
 - (i) the respondent;
 - (ii) any other person to whom the order is to apply whether or not the person is a party to the proceedings; and
 - (iii) the police officer in charge of the police station located nearest to the area where the respondent or the applicant resides.

Breach of protection order

- 18. (1) A person against whom an order has been made a direction has been issued by the Court, commits an off person-
 - (a) has notice of the order or direction; and
 - (b) contravenes any provision of the order or fai with the direction.
- (2) A person who commits an offence under subscliable-
 - (a) on a first summary conviction to a fine no five thousand dollars or to a term of impris exceeding three months;
 - (b) on a second summary conviction, to exceeding ten thousand dollars or to imprisonment not exceeding one year or b
 - (c) on any subsequent summary conviction, to imprisonment not exceeding five years.
- (3) Where an order contains a direction of the Cot to section 7 that the respondent seek counselling or therap brought to the attention of the Court that the respondent has neglected to comply with such a direction and the Court fine refusal or neglect was unreasonable, the respondent commits and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding to dollars.

PART III

POLICE POWERS OF ENTRY AND ARREST

Duties of police officers

- 19. (1) A police officer shall respond to every complai alleging domestic violence whether or not the person making th or the report is the victim.
- (2) A police officer responding to a domestic violenc shall complete a domestic violence report which shall for Domestic Violence Register to be maintained by the Comp Police in the prescribed manner.
- (3) A domestic violence report must be in the forr Form 8 in Schedule 2 and must include but not be limited to-
 - (a) the name of the parties;

- (b) the relationship and sex of the parties;
- (c) information relating to the history of domestic violence between the parties;
- (d) the date and time the complaint was received;
- (e) the type of the abuse and the weapon used, if any.
- 20. Where a judicial officer is satisfied, by information on oath, that-

Issue -

- (a) there are reasonable grounds to suspect that a person on a premises has suffered or is in imminent danger of physical injury at the hands of another person in a situation amounting to domestic violence and needs assistance to deal with or prevent the injury; and
- (b) a police officer has been refused permission to enter the premises for the purpose of giving assistance to the first mentioned person in paragraph (a),

the judicial officer may issue a warrant in writing authorising a police officer to enter the premises specified in the warrant at any time within twenty four hours after the issue of the warrant and subject to any conditions specified in the warrant, to take such action as is necessary to prevent the commission or repetition of the offence or a breach of the peace or to protect life or property.

21. (1) A police officer may act in accordance with the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code where he or she has reasonable cause to believe that a person is engaging in or attempting to engage in conduct which amounts to physical violence and failure to act immediately may result in serious physical injury or death.

Police arrest warra

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- (2) This section does not authorise the entry onto premises by a police officer, for the purpose of any search or the arrest of any person, otherwise than in connection with the conduct referred to in subsection (1).
- (3) Where a police officer exercises a power of entry pursuant to subsection (1), he or she shall immediately submit a written report to the Commissioner of Police, through the head of his or her division where the incident occurred, and the report shall contain-
 - (a) the reasons for entering the premises without a warrant;
 - (b) the offence being committed or about to be committed;and

- (c) the manner in which the investigation was and the measures taken to ensure the and safety of the person at risk.
- (4) The report referred to in subsection (3) must be to the Director of Public Prosecutions by the Commissions within seven days of its receipt by the Commissioner of Po
- (5) Where a complaint is made against a police of person resident in a premises alleging that the entry of officer onto the premises pursuant to subsection (1) was unthe Committee shall investigate the complaint and submit a report to the Commissioner of Police and the Director Prosecutions within fourteen days of the complaint having I
- (6) Where the investigation of the Committee find made pursuant to subsection (1) was unwarranted, the shall also submit the report to the Police Service Commissic report may form the basis of disciplinary action against officer.
- (7) For the purposes of subsections (5) ar "Committee" means the Police Oversight Committee or so or entity charged with responsibility for receiving or in complaints made against police officers.

 - (a) assist a person who has suffered injury;
 - (b) ensure the welfare and safety of a child or who may be on the premises; and
 - (c) prevent any further breach of the law.

 - (b) suspend the execution of such a warrant compliance with any prohibition, cobligation or order imposed under section

Powers to make arrest where a final protection is in force 24. Where a final protection order is in force and a perbelieves on reasonable grounds that the respondent has commutting a breach of the final protection order, he or she madetain the respondent without a warrant.

Existing criminal law to apply

- 25. (1) Subject to subsection (2), where a person pursuant to section 20 or 21, the person shall be charged in with the relevant provisions of the criminal law for committing c to commit any of the offences and shall be dealt with accord

 - (b) based on a report from a probation officer, the Director, an approved social worker or a police officer, domestic violence is likely to be perpetrated against the applicant; or
 - (c) the applicant has become fearful of the respondent to the extent that he or she is no longer willing to continue the domestic relationship.

 - (d) any hardship that may be caused to the reother members of the family if bail is not g
- (2) The Court in granting bail, may order that the rebe subject to any one or more of the following conditions, a considers appropriate-
 - (a) that the respondent not harass or mole another person to harass or molest the app
 - (b) that the respondent not be present on the which the applicant works or resides;
 - (c) that the respondent not be in a locality situated the premises in which the applica resides; and

- (d) that the respondent not be in a locality or on the premises in which is situated the place of education of a child, if it is necessary to protect the welfare of that child.
- (3) Where a police officer believes on reasonable grounds that a person, who has been admitted to bail subject to one or more conditions, has failed to comply with a condition of the recognisance, the police officer may arrest the person without a warrant.
- 37. A person who contravenes any prohibition, condition, obligation or order imposed under this Act and for which a penalty is not stipulated commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand dollars or to a term of imprisonment not exceeding five years or to both such fine and imprisonment.

38. The Minister may make regulations to give effect to this Act.
